Students are to log into their CCSD account and click the Mackinvea app and type in the title of the book.



Summer Book Projects: Complete one per book.

<p>Make a new book jacket for your novel. Most important scene=front cover, Your recommendation=Back cover, Title and author=book spine, Summary of the book without giving away the ending=front flap, Information about the author=Back flap</p>	<p>Create a board game for the book. Include some of the <u>characters, conflicts, achievements, and setting details.</u></p>	<p>Design a travel brochure for the book. Include setting details, conflicts that might be encountered as potential “excursions”, “famous people” --the characters from your story</p>	<p>Create a detailed map for the book’s setting. Include <u>key places from your story and why they are significant.</u></p>
<p>Pretend you are a character from your book and write a friendly or not so friendly letter/email to another character in the book. Make sure you are detailed and include many text references including <u>conflict, setting, and resolution.</u></p>	<p>Write a song that reveals the <u>major theme and major conflict</u> from the book.</p>	<p>Create a detailed timeline (illustrations required, drawn or clipart) for your book.</p>	<p>Write a skit that tells the story of the novel in one scene.</p>
<p>Create a soundtrack for your novel. Explain why you chose each song (why it is an appropriate choice--why it stands for a particular character or chapter/event) You must have at least 8 songs)</p>	<p>Word collage. Write the title of the book in the center of a sheet of paper. Then look through magazines for words, phrases, and sentences that illustrate or tell something about your book. As you look, think in terms of the <u>theme, setting, plot line, as well as characters.</u> Work to get fifty such words, phrases, or sentences so the whole sheet of paper will be covered. Explain your choices on the back of your collage.</p>	<p>Title acrostic. Take a sheet of construction paper and write the title of the book down the side of the paper. For each letter in the title, construct a <u>sentence</u> that begins with that letter and that tells something significant about the story.</p>	<p>Cartoon squares. Create a series of six drawings in six squares that shows a <u>significant event</u> in the novel. Under each picture or cartoon, write a few lines of explanation.</p>
